A Step-By-Step Guide to Selecting Your Dentist

hen you are evaluating the dental professional who will help you and your family maintain the highest level of health, you need to consider a few factors beyond whether or not the dentist is on your insurance list and if the dental office is in the next block.

What are your dental needs? Are you sure that you are even aware of the condition of your mouth? Has anyone sat down with you and explained what a healthy mouth looks like? Have you been offered a chance to see how your mouth measures up to "great health"? This process takes time. It does not happen in a five-minute exam and a five-minute consultation.

Who selected the dentists on "your list"? Did you know that almost any dentist can be on any list of "preferred providers"? The requirement is that he or she will sign the contract to work for a fee set by the insurance company following the treatment "guidelines of the insurance company." That's about it!

There are few (if any) extraordinary requirements for education, experience, excellence, or patient satisfaction; few (if any) requirements beyond those of state licensure for participation in most dental insurance preferred provider plans. It's about "the buck"--accepting a reduced fee so the insurance company (middle man) can make a profit while corralling as many participants from as many employers and agents as possible. And usually the less treatment you receive, the more the insurance company makes. If that is all you are looking for in a health care provider, just about any dentist should keep you happy. If you have high expectations for you and your family, you might want to evaluate your choice a little closer.

Your needs determine the right dentist for you. If your mouth is truly healthy, if you are blessed with healthy gums and strong, straight, perfect teeth and a relentless daily drive to personally maintain them by flossing and brushing, there is a good chance that almost any dentist can help you monitor your dental health. Congratulations!

Unfortunately, most of us have somewhat greater needs. Consider that many of us have lost a tooth or teeth, or have had a number of restorative dental procedures by the time we reach adulthood. Also consider that the old restorative techniques--silver fillings and "porcelain-fused-to-whatever metal" crowns--deteriorate and discolor our teeth and gums

over time. Teeth shift and wear. Bone levels change. Gums recede.

Is the dentist who spends his day seeing 30 or 40 patients, two or three or even four patients at a time, going to spend the time educating you and finally helping you clinically to your highest potential? Is this dentist going to personally have the time to treat you and your family, or will the details of your treatment be left to his "helper" (whose last name you don't even know) as he sprints on to the next person on "your list". If you feel like a number in the dental office...that's exactly what you are!

Verify your dentist's expertise and credentials with the State Board. Have there been disciplinary actions taken against the dentist's licenses to practice? Is that OK by you?

Look at photos of cases in your dentist's office that may be similar to yours. Compare pictures of your condition, before and after treatment, to other patients the dentist has personally helped. You can see dental excellence in photos. Are the tissues natural-looking after treatment? Can you see the gum line and is it natural looking? If being technologically upto-date is important to you, look at your dentist's web site and library of digital photography of his case work. If the dental office doesn't have these in 2019 and beyond, maybe technology is not the focus of that particular office.

If all of the photos are canned (purchased from a distributor of dental web sites--you can tell) then you have no documentation of the capacity for generation of beautiful dentistry of this dental office. If the web site is all commercially generated information, not personally written by the owner, you can bet that there will be little personal contribution to the dentistry you receive.



In other words, just like the cleanliness of the floor and bathroom reflects the clinical cleanliness of a dental office, the web site of a dental office should be a reflection of the personal care provided on a day-to-day basis by the dentist.

The Internet can be a good source for finding a dentist in this age of technology and information. Read testimonials of existing patients carefully. Verify credentials by reference to State board web sites. Ask about your dentist's recent continuing education. A dentist practicing at the standard levels when he graduated would probably be far below current standards of sterilization, barrier techniques, surgical excellence, and restorative techniques. Responsible continuing education develops competence in modern dental technology including new CT-based diagnosis, digital radiology, implant dentistry, new and beautiful biologically compatible restorative materials, sterile technique, bone grafting and atraumatic surgical techniques. Ask about it!

Don't be a victim of desperate marketing attempts to grab patients with loss -leaders like "free whitening" or "free exams and x-rays". Believe me: Nothing of substance in dentistry comes for "free".

If you are looking for the finest dentistry available for you and your family, demand to see it in photos, in writing, in the words of existing patients, in continuing education credentials, in on-on-one conversations with the dentist who will personally partner with you to help you get what you want! You are the one responsible for your dental health and the selection of your dentist.

Help! My Face is CHANGING!



The bones of your face deteriorate when you lose your teeth.

If you are wearing a denture that was made 10 years ago, it is likely that the denture does not fit your remaining jawbone or your face. Did you know that when you have a tooth pulled you also lose the bone around it? If you lose several teeth in a row you quickly lose large quantities of the bone that kept your jaw strong and your face looking young. The more bone you lose, the more your face sags. If you ask the dentist to put those teeth back, odds are you will get a bridge, partial, or a denture that may even speed up the loss of bone.

How do you stop losing bone after you have lost your teeth? A famous dental educator has stated that there are two ways to stop bone loss: eternal rest or dental implants. You see, when a removable dental appliance or denture sits on your gums, it may look and feel good for a while, but the bone that it sits on always goes away, quickly at first, and then slowly, but with very dramatic results. In fact, if you are wearing a denture that was made 10 years ago, it is likely that the denture does not fit your remaining jawbone or your face. Why do you think so many older denture patients wear dental adhesive? Their dentures just can't hang on to what little bone is left.

How can you avoid losing the precious bone that makes your face look young and healthy? Keep your teeth and gums healthy. If you lose a tooth, have it replaced with a dental implant before you lose the bone in your face. Dental implants restore the stress and strain to the bone in a healthy way so that it doesn't atrophy. While it is unfortunate to lose one of your chewing tools, it is great news that it can be replaced with a long term dental implant. Your new tooth can be made to look and chew just like the one you were born with!

Here are some of the questions and comments we commonly hear during consultations with new patients:

"But my tooth has been gone for a while. The dentist didn't offer implants as an option. There is already a dent in my jaw where I know the bone is missing." A safe, inexpensive dental CT scan can precisely show the amount of bone lost so you can get the picture and make plans to stay healthy. Some of these areas can be restored with bone from your own mouth--a bone graft. Ouch? Not so bad. Sort of the same discomfort you experienced losing a tooth should be expected when having a bone graft with current techniques and medicines. After a few months healing, a dental implant and crown can be placed into the grafted bone to restore stability and beauty.

"What happens if I ignore these areas of bone deterioration?" If you wait too long you can plan on wearing removable dental

appliances forever. Frankly, dentures and dental adhesive were never something I wanted for myself when I got old. I'll take every small step I can to hold on to my teeth and the bone around my teeth, so I can chew and smile like a kid, even when I'm eighty... or a hundred!

Talk to your dentist about dental implants, bone grafting, and about how you can keep the bone of your jaws healthy. Don't become a "dental cripple". Discuss this problem with someone with training, experience, and knowledge about maintenance of your jaw bone health.

How can dental implants help me?



- **One tooth:** A dental implant can be the support for a single tooth replacement without involving the adjacent teeth, like a bridge. Grafting at time of tooth loss can ensure a great foundation for an implant-supported restoration that can last a lifetime.
- All Teeth: SmileNow, a digitally planned and guided technique to safely and precisely replace a full arch of teeth can be the answer for a person who has failing dentistry, long standing deterioration of their teeth, or poor dental restorations –"Bad Dentures".
- **Cosmetics:** We have been privileged to witness dramatic transformations in the way some of our patients look and the return of a youthful, confident smile. Implants preserve the bone in areas where teeth have been removed. They can maintain a youthful facial profile, and prevent sagging jaws and premature aging of the face.
- **Health:** Dental implants can restore your mouth to health, are easy to clean, and maintain a fresh oral environment. They can help to maintain bone levels for strong jaws, and restore the ability to chew a healthy diet.

Is this the best treatment available - modern and safe?

Dr. O'Connor uses digitally based treatment planning with Cone Beam CT scans for 3D digital planning based upon your unique anatomy for safe and predictable surgical outcomes. We have a Carestream 9300 Cone Beam CT scanner and do in-house 3D planning and printing of implant surgical guides.

Dr. O'Connor has been surgically placing and doing all the restorative work for more than 30 years. He has used Cone beam CT for planning implant placement for more than a decade, and has placed dental implants with digitally fabricated guides exclusively for years.

Why should I call Dr. O'Connor for dental implants?

- **He is your coach!** At your first appointment with Dr. O'Connor, you will have an in-depth consultation when you can let him know what you want, for him to tell you what is possible, and to give you a sound basis to decide on your treatment. Begin with the end in mind. Get informed with respect to benefit of implants, the nature of the treatment, the cost, and alternatives before you make your treatment decisions.

How does the SmileNow procedure replace all teeth in one arch, in one day?

The **SmileNow** Technique works like this:

- An appointment is made to digitally diagnose and plan your treatment and to discuss the time and financial investment that you will make. Frequently a digital PreVue of your final smile can be made available at this appointment.
- A short, completely comfortable, information gathering appointment is made to secure all the needed data to digitally plan and fabricate guides for implant placement and bone shaping, as well as to digitally place your guided **SmileNow** restoration. This information is sent to one of our digital labs, analyzed and processed, and a final digitally-guided plan is made.
- When the laboratory work has been returned (including your new digital smile), a presedation appointment is made to discuss the sedation and surgical protocols you have selected. We will set the date for your **SmileNow** procedure.
- **SmileNow** Technique: you are driven to our office by a designated driver because of medications already working in your system to keep you comfortable. You are gently sedated with oral medications. Anesthetics are administered comfortably. Teeth are removed if necessary. Guided implant placement is performed under sedation, and digitally guided replacements for your teeth are secured in place.
- No dentures or days with missing teeth. You awake with your new smile and are mostly unaware of any of the procedure. Your driver will take you home where you can safely take a nap and rest. We will check you the following day for post-operative health and comfort.
- 4-6 months later, a final prosthesis is fabricated in three or four simple, painless appointments.



What is All-on-4?

All-on-4 is a trademarked treatment procedure that involves placing four implants to support a full arch of replacement teeth with an acrylic-based prosthesis. It typically involves angled implants placed to avoid the need for bone grafting.

There is controversy over the use of only four implants because loss of an implant can be cause for the patient to be forced into wearing a denture.

Dr. O'Connor frequently recommends placement of more than four implants based upon your anatomy and the force factors that may contribute to stress on your implants. However, each patient is different in this respect.

How much pain is involved?

Rarely do patients need pain meds other than Nsaids (Non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs), Advil or Tylenol. Our patients enjoy Oral Moderate Sedation dentistry and efficient, digitally-guided surgical procedures for a comfortable, relaxed experience.

How much does it cost?



Implant dentistry is an investment in your future health and well-being. The costs are different based upon the complexity of the implant treatment and the number of teeth being replaced. One implant can usually support one tooth. There is economy in having multiple teeth restored in that a complete arch (14 teeth) can frequently be replaced using only 4-6 implants. Implant dentistry can be as affordable as a bicycle and as precious as buying a car.

How do people pay for this treatment?

- It is my experience that Medicare and Medicaid benefits in the state of Missouri do not include dental implants.
- Most of my patients have dental insurance and get great benefits for their treatment. Unfortunately, dental insurance is usually limited to an annual maximum that is not high enough to completely cover implant dentistry. The annual maximum limits vary by plan. We will help you with all necessary paperwork to make your claim so your insurance carrier can reimburse you to the level of your benefit coverage.
- There are low-interest options, including a home equity loan, borrowing from your 401k and/or help from a family member.
- Third-party financing is available with payments as low as **\$500 a month** for qualified applicants.

Patient Case Studies

Patient enters dental office in fear – but leaves in comfort

The woman was so frightened that she trembled while shaking my hand. A 44-year-old mother and infrequent dental patient, she admitted that oral care ranked "low on my priority list." But the patient also recognized that "I want to keep my teeth, and if I continue putting off going to the dentist I will lose them."

The medical history revealed mild, exercise-induced asthma, acid reflux, and occasional bouts of bronchitis. The woman – 5'6" and 246 pounds – regularly takes Advair®, Ventolin HFA® and Prilosec®. She uses Tylenol® and Aleve® for toothaches and headaches. During the dental exam I discovered deep, carious lesions in multiple teeth. A painful lower-left bicuspid was previously treated endodontically; however, due to a gross class V carious lesion the tooth was no longer restorable. Severe bruxism, acid reflux disease, and neglected caries had cosmetically compromised the esthetics of the patient's maxillary anterior teeth and smile.

The presence of asthma warranted a presedation consultation with the patient's medical doctor who assessed risk as "negligible." (It was recommended, however, that she carry an inhaler to all dental visits.) The initial treatment plan called for a series of long appointments. Among other actions these involved:

- Removal of the painful bicuspid and place an implant (single-stage surgery) with healing abutment
- Excavating gross caries in maxillary anterior teeth
- Preparation of maxillary anterior teeth for esthetic restorations (ceramic restorations with aluminous porcelain copings)
- Restoring the occlusal plane and eliminating caries (4 crowns and 2 composite restorations).

The plan also scheduled delivery of maxillary posterior restorations and preparation and impressions of mandibular left crowns and implant restoration; cementation of mandibular crowns, operative dentistry in mandibular left quadrant, and mandibular anterior allograft using Alloderm[®] tissue matrix and flapless tunneling technique (per Dr. Pat Allen). All sedation appointments were conducted using DOCS Education's incremental protocol #2.

The patient was prescribed 10 mg Valium[®] for the night prior to her visit and she presented in the morning NPO. She was instructed to take 0.25 mg triazolam one hour prior to her appointment and was premedicated with 1000 mg Amoxicillin[®] and 8 mg Decadron[®] the morning of the sedation appointment. The patient was hooked up to a vital signs monitor, assessed for initial awareness verbally and subsequently administered 0.5 mg triazolam and 30 mg hydroxyzine. Local anesthetic used included 4% Citanest[®] Plain Dental and 4% Septocaine[®] with 1:100,000 Epinephrine. During initial injections nitrous oxide was administered for a short period, followed by O₂ throughout using the nitrous oxide mask.

The patient tolerated the sedation appointments extremely well and thanked all the participating doctors enthusiastically.

Our office is equipped with the Carestream 9300 CBCT (Cone Beam Computerized Tomograph). For the past

two years, we have relied solely on this state-of-theart modality for 3D Digital diagnosis. Coupled with 3D diagnostic software, digital planning makes dentistry at our office safe, more streamlined, and economical.

Physicians have relied on CAT (Computerized Axial Tomography) scans for many years. CAT scans are X-ray procedures that use many different X-ray images with the help of computers to generate cross-sectional or even 3D views of internal organs and structures within the body.

A knee replacement surgery, for example, would never be performed

without first examining 3D imaging. More recently, dentists have begun to rely on 3D imaging techniques and CBCT

scans to provide them with a detailed view of the mouth and skull. The advantage that 3D imaging holds over regular dental x-rays is that bone structure, bone density, tissues, and nerves can be viewed clearly. CBCT scans can be completed in less than half a minute.

The main use for CBCT scans is as an aid to plan dental implant treatment and other oral surgery. Dental implants are the most sophisticated replacement for missing teeth, but have historically proven to be time-consuming to place.

CBCT scans vastly reduce the time it takes to place implants.



How are Cone Beam Computerized Tomography (CBCT) scans used?

CBCT scans are advantageous because they allow the dentist to magnify specific areas of the face. In addition, the dentist can easily view cross-sectional "slices" of the jaw, which makes planning treatment easier and faster.

Here are some of the main ways in which CBCT scans are used in dentistry:

- Assess the quality of the jawbone where the implant will be placed.
- Determine where nerves are located.
- Diagnose tumors and disease in the early stages.
- Measure the density of the jawbone where the implant will be placed.
- Pinpoint the most effective placement for implants, including the angle of best fit.
- Plan the complete surgical procedure in advance, from start to finish.
- Precisely decide on the appropriate size and type of implants.
- View exact orientation and position of each tooth.
- View impacted teeth.

How are CBCT scans performed?

CBCT scans are quick and simple to perform. A Cone Beam Imaging System is at the heart of the CBCT scanner. The cone beams are used to take literally hundreds of pictures of the face. These pictures are used to compile an exact 3D image of the inner mechanisms of the face and jaw. The dentist is able to zoom in on specific areas and view them from alternate angles.

Previous patients report the CBCT scanner is comfortable because they remain in a sitting position at all times. Additionally, the scanner provides an open environment, meaning that claustrophobic feelings are eliminated. The CBCT scan is an incredible tool that minimizes the cost of dental treatment, reduces treatment time, and enhances the end results of dental surgery.
